Waldo Williams (1904–1971) oedd un o feirdd Cymraeg mwyaf blaenllaw yr 20fed ganrif. Roedd hefyd yn enwog am ei ddaliadau heddychol, am fod yn ymgyrchwr gwrth-ryfel ac yn genedlaetholwr Cymraeg. Dengys ei farddoniaeth amrywiaeth o ddylanwadau, o William Wordsworth a Walt Whitman i emynau Cymraeg a mesur caeth y gynghanedd. **Dr Damian Walford Davies**, Uwch Ddarlithydd Saesneg ym Mhrifysgol Aberystwyth, sydd wedi cynllunio'r daith hon gyda'r Academi a byddwn yn ymweld â llyfeydd megis Capel Brynconin, safle bedd teulu Waldo, Carreg Waldo yn Rhos-fach ger Mynachlog-ddu a man cyfarfod y Crynwyr yn Aberdaugleddau.

Waldo Williams in Pembrokeshire

Saturday 9 May 2009

Departure/Arrival point: Carmarthen
Welsh language tour: No English translation will be provided

Waldo Williams (1904–1971) was one of the leading Welsh-language poets of the 20th century. He was also a notable pacifist, anti-war campaigner, and Welsh nationalist. His poetry shows many influences, from William Wordsworth and Walt Whitman to Welsh hymns and traditional Welsh 'cynghanedd'. **Dr Damian Walford Davies**, Senior Lecturer for English at Aberystwyth University, will lead this tour and take us to places like Brynconin Chapel, the site of Waldo's grave, the Waldo Williams memorial stone (the 'cofeb') at Rhosfach and the Quaker Meeting House in Milford Haven.

Ganed **Roland Mathias** (1915–2007), yr awdur a'r beirniad llenyddol, yng Nglyn Collwn (safle presennol cronfa ddŵr Talybont) ac fe'i claddwyd ym mynwent hardd y capel yn Aber. Bydd y wibdaith yn rhoi cyfle i ni edrych ar ei waith trwy'r cerddi a ysgrifennodd amdano'i hun, ei deulu a thirlun ei ieuencid. **Sam Adams**, golygydd 'Collected Poems' a 'Collected Stories' fydd yn traddodi'r ddarlith agoriadol a bydd **Dr John Pikoulis**, Cyd-gadeirydd yr Academi, yn trafod ei farddoniaeth. Bydd mab y bardd, **Glyn Mathias** yn ymuno â ni ar y wibdaith ac yn cyfrannu ffrwyth ei ymchwil yntau i hanes ei deulu.

Roland Mathias at Talybont-on-Usk

Roland Mathias (1915–2007) was a writer and critic who was born in Glyn Collwn (the site of the present reservoir at Talybont) and is buried in the picturesque country chapel at Aber. This tour will examine his work through the poems he wrote about himself, his family and the landscape of his youth. **Sam Adams**, editor of his 'Collected Poems' and 'Collected Stories', will join tour leader **Dr John Pikoulis**, Academi's Co-Chair, to discuss his poetry. The poet's son, **Glyn Mathias**, will accompany us on the day and contribute his own research into the family history.

Gwibdaith trwy gyfrwng y Saesneg

Nid oes ffuglen sy'n ymateb i hanes meysydd glo'r de yn yr un modd â gweithiau **Lewis Jones** (1897–1939), 'Cwmardy' a 'We Live'. Bydd y wibdaith hon yn cynnwys taith gerdded ar hyd ochr afon Clydach, heibio i ddau lyn ac i ganol y mynyddoedd yn ogystal ag ymweliad â safle hen bwll glo y Cambrian; man canolog i'w nofelau. Lewis Jones in Clydach Vale

No more extraordinary fictional response to the history of the south Wales coalfield has been written than **Lewis Jones's** (1897–1939) 'Cwmardy' and 'We Live'. This tour includes a walk up the Clydach river past two lakes and up into the mountains as well as the site of the old Cambrian Colliery. We will visit the sites of Jones's two homes in the village, including the one where the novels were written. The tour starts at the Heritage Park Hotel, where **Dr Ben Curtis** will talk about the social and political history of the valley and **Dr John Pikoulis**, Academi's Co-Chair, will examine Jones's personality in the light of 'Cwmardy'.

This tour will visit his alleged birthplace Brogynin, Llanbadarn Chapel (where 'Merched Llanbadarn' was written) and we will take in the breathtaking medieval magic of Ystrad Fflur/Strata Florida Abbey. **Dr Huw Meirion Edwards**, Senior Lecturer at the Department of Welsh, Aberystwyth University, will guide this tour and transport you back in time to evoke the spirit of one of Wales' heroes. You will even get a chance at trying your skill at 'cynghanedd' over lunch at the Talbot in Tregaron.
